His mother bore him in weakness and hardship upon weakness and hardship, and his weaning is in two years – give thanks to Me and to your parents. Unto Me is the final destination

But if they (both) strive with you to make you join in worship with me others that of which you have no knowledge, then obey them not; but behave with them in the world kindly and follow the path of him who turns to me in repentance and in obedience. then to Me will be your return, and I shall tell you what you used to do.

b. Noun Phrase

Noun phrase is derived from two words they are noun and phrase. Noun means a word modifies a thing or pronoun where as phrase is a group of words refers to one sense so noun phrase is a group of words refers to one noun indeed all what added to a root of a word can be said as a phrase example book, is the root, ing as an addition so booking is a phrase not as a noun any more. Noun phrase also can be define as group of words which is always ended by a noun as a central idea and leded by modifier or determiner directly related to the ended word such as a new Al-qur'an.

The determiners here can be come from noun, adjective, and verb such as translation Al-quran, holy Al-quran, sitting praying. The function of the noun phrase as the function of a noun in a sentence they are as a subject and the object in a sentence.
